

Survivor's Rights and Clery Act Procedural Information

Steps survivors may choose to follow if dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking has occurred:

- Law Enforcement Involvement Survivors have the right to notify police or decline police involvement. If you choose to inform the police, campus security authorities can assist with the notification or dial 912.384.7675 on the Douglas Campus or 912.287.4335 on the Waycross Campus.
- Preserve Evidence Preserving evidence in sexual assault cases is imperative if you
 wish to involve law enforcement. For example, avoid showering, douching, eating,
 drinking, or brushing your teeth, as this can destroy vital evidence. Bedding or
 clothing worn during or after the assault should be preserved and collected by law
 enforcement.
- Title IX Involvement You may also report to the Title IX Coordinator at 912.260.4375.
- Protection Orders and No-Contact Orders Where applicable, the police will assist with acquiring, serving, and enforcing court orders.

Protecting the confidentiality of survivors:

- Conversations are kept as confidential as possible, but information about the
 incident must be shared with relevant administrators and the Title IX Coordinator so
 that actions can be taken if necessary for safety. In planning a response, the
 survivor's wishes are given full consideration.
- Names of survivors of sexual assault will not be released unless required by law (e.g., court order).

Options and assistance are available to survivors in changing academic, living, transportation, and working situations.

 The Dean of Students and Housing for Student Success or the Title IX Coordinator can speak to you about possible assistance for changing academic, living, and transportation situations. These remedies may be made if they are reasonably available, regardless of whether or not you choose to report the incident of sexual misconduct or interpersonal violence to law enforcement.

What are the procedures for disciplinary action in cases of alleged dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking?

 Survivors may file a conduct report for violations of the college's policy. The Dean of Students and Housing for Student Success is available to guide you through the conduct process and to answer any questions you may have. Refer to the SGSC Student Services page on the SGSC website for the Student Code of Conduct and the student complaint process.

TITLE IX RIGHTS AND OPTIONS

If you choose not to notify law enforcement, you can still file a complaint with the Title IX Coordinator. For more information regarding Title IX, refer to the Title IX page of the SGSC Website.
