

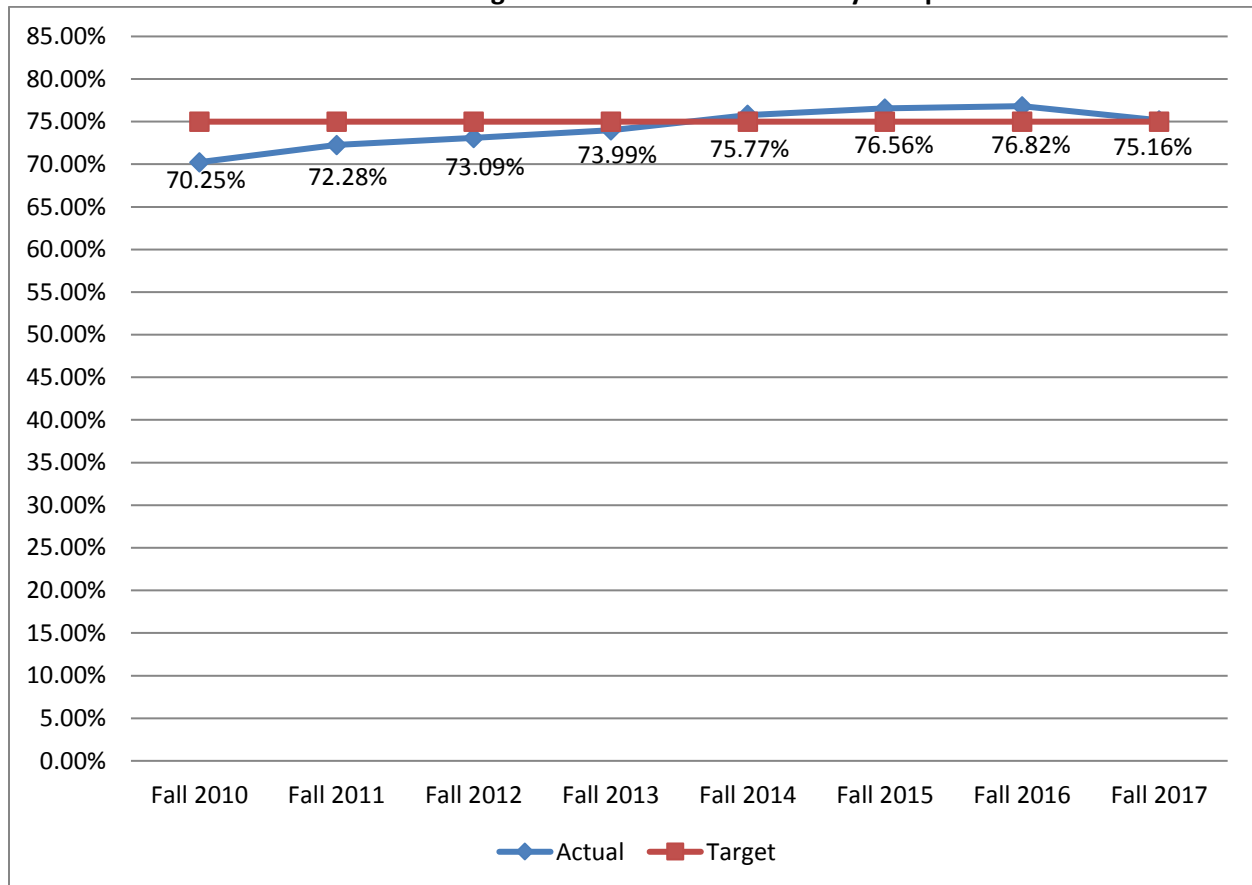

**Percentage of Credits Hours Successfully Completed**

The College monitors credit hours successfully completed vs. credits hours attempted as a measure of success of its undergraduate programs. SGSC has set its benchmark at Fall 2013 and the target is to meet or exceed a 75 percent course success rate each semester. Over the last four years, SGSC's credit hours completed successfully has met the benchmark.

Credits hours successfully completed is the sum of earned hours (with a grade of A, B, C, P or S) divided by sum of attempted hours (with a grade of A, B, C, D, F, U, W, or WF).
