


NCLEX-RN Pass Rates for First-Time Candidates (ASN)

The College's School of Nursing tracks pass rates for licensure examinations. The acceptable NCLEX-RN pass rate mandated by the Georgia Board of Nursing is 80 percent and this is the benchmark for SGSC. In all years since 2013 with the exception of 2015, SGSC cohorts have exceeded the mandated benchmark.




Exhibit 2: South Georgia State College vs. University of System of Georgia State College Sector, NCLEX-RN Pass Rates for First Time Candidates by Institution
